Assistant Professor of Pastoral Theology

The goal of this course is to equip students for lay leadership by helping them develop the charism of pastoral care. Students will learn about the theological and practical dimensions of care with individuals, families, and faith communities. This course will involve discussion, case studies, and role plays that will give students an opportunity to practice pastoral caregiving. It will also pay attention to the unique role that church communities can play in caregiving.

The Rev. Dr. Danielle Tumminio Hansen is the Assistant Professor of Pastoral Theology at Seminary of the Southwest and Director of Field Education. She teaches courses on pastoral care, practical theology, and the intersection of trauma and theology. She is the author of three books and editor of an anthology of spiritual stories.

“Reformed Theology”

Taught by

Rev. Dr. David Jensen

This course explores some of the pivotal themes and doctrines of Christian faith—such as God, Christ, Holy Spirit, and the church—and the distinctive accents of the Reformed tradition. Together, we pay attention to some of the classical voices in our tradition (such as John Calvin) as well as contemporary witnesses (such as the Belhar Confession). Finally, we reflect on what it means to be a part of a *living* theological tradition at this moment in the church’s history, and how our voices add to that tradition.

The Rev. Dr. David Jensen has been teaching at Austin Seminary since 2001. He was appointed to the Frierson Chair in 2013 and appointed academic dean in 2014. His teaching and research explore the interconnections between Christian theology and daily life.

Dr. Jensen’s books include 1 and 2 Samuel and Always Being Reformed: Challenges and Prospects for the Future of Reformed Theology, Flourishing Desire: A Theology of Human Sexuality, Parenting, Living Hope: The Future and Christian Faith; The Lord and Giver of Life: Perspectives on Constructive Pneumatology; Responsive Labor: A Theology of Work; Graced Vulnerability: A Theology of Childhood; and In the Company of Others: A Dialogical Christology. He is currently writing a book on the history of Christian interpretations of Jesus.

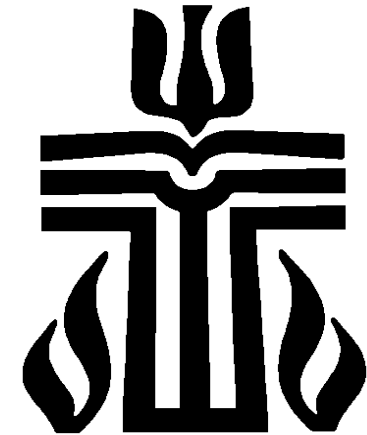

Presbyteries are looking for ways to help Southeast Asian congregations enjoy all the advantages of the Presbyterian Church (USA), including seminary - training leadership. The Southeast Asian Lay Training Program, initiated by General Assembly's National Laotian Presbyterian Council through Rev. Dr. James Oudom, educated key leaders in the basic Presbyterian doctrine and practice as prescribed for Lay Commissioned Pastors in the Book of Order in the past 25 years.

The program continues to serve all Asian American Congregations by Asian Intercultural Congregational Support Office, Racial Equity & Women's Intercultural Ministry, Presbyterian Mission Agency, PCUSA.

The program consists of six core courses taught over the course of three summers: Reform Theology / Presbyterian Polity / Worship & Sacrament / Bible Interpretation / Teaching in the Reform Tradition / Reform Preaching. Other languages than English can be provided as needed. Successful completion of the six courses earns certification that the graduate has received adequate education to carry out the duties of a lay commissioned pastor.

Austin Seminary via its Office of Continuing Education will issue 1.5 Credit Unit certification of each course study.

Courses for continuing education such as Pastoral Care or Mission & Evangelism and others may be offered, if requested.

Lack of lay commissioned pastors has resulted in Southeast Asian Congregations not celebrating the Holy Sacraments of the Lord in their own languages. The Lay Training Certification Program is meant to equip and facilitate the lay leaders to meet the requirements of the commissioning process. Full partnership in ministry and worship is the goal.
